#### Grassroots Events Organising, with LaDIYfest Sheffield

Ever wondered how to organise your own feminist event or about the kinds of dilemmas we sometimes face when planning events? Join us for a short interactive session where we will give you scenarios to think about and discuss in small groups, before getting a chance to quiz some of the organisers of LaDIYfest if you have any specific questions!

Let's Talk About Race in Feminist & Music Spaces, Stephanie Phillips I will be talking about the history of people of colour in punk / diy / feminist spaces, explaining how in many cases they have been marginalised by white feminists / punks and how white allies can help further the narrative around race in political spaces. I will dedicate some of my talk to the riot grrrl movement and discuss how that failed women of colour.

## Online Misogyny and Harassment of Women, Tara Matthew (Wipeout Sexism on Facebook)

An open and informal discussion workshop focusing on online misogyny. A space for people to share their experiences of sexism on the Internet – particularly social media sites such as Facebook and Twitter. We'll be talking about how to deal with it, what to do if you're subjected to it, how to cohesively move forward and how we, as feminists, can eradicate it.

## Feminist T-Shirt Making, with Sheffield Students' Union Women's Committee

The aim of the workshop is for everyone who attends to make their own feminist t-shirt or tote bag. We will have tote bags and plain white cotton t-shirts in a wide range of sizes, including children's sizes. We will show you how to stencil a logo or design on to your t-shirt or bag using plastic stencils and fabric paint (all materials will be provided).

**Gender Dynamics in Poly Relationships,** Georgia Walker Churchman This workshop will focus on the ways in which gender inequality plays out in polyamorous relationships, and what people who are in poly relationships already, or who would consider that possibility in the future, can do to combat them.

**Women and Anti-Fascism,** with Sisters Against the EDL This workshop will introduce participants to Sisters Against the EDL, explain why the group was set up and provide guidelines and advice for setting up your own group in Sheffield. There will also be an opportunity to discuss your personal experiences of the gender dynamics in anti-fascist organising and protest.

#### Fat Activism, Charlotte Cooper

The main aim of the workshop is to enable people to deepen their knowledge of fat activism. But the workshop also aims to encourage people to undertake and customise fat activism for themselves.

## Creating Spaces Free from Sexual Harassment, with the SASH Campaign

This workshop aims to create a safe space for discussion about sexual harassment; providing people a chance to share their experiences of sexual harassment as well as experiences combating it. We want input into the Sheffield Anti-Sexual Harassment campaign to enable it to be successful.

#### Men and Feminism, Alex Young and Charlotte Jones

This workshop is for people of all genders to collaboratively explore men's role in feminism and feminist movements. It will involve personal stories and discussion around issues such as: calling men out on sexist behaviour and how they/you respond, men and sexist behaviour in other activist movements, and issues of naming.

## Magic & Mythmaking: (re)writing queer and feminist fairytales, Hel Gurney

This workshops aims to facilitate discussion around gender and queerness in fairytales, in a register appropriate for all ages, hoping to inspire and enable workshop participants to write their own fairytales which reflect their own experiences/understandings of gender and/or of queerness.

National Ugly Mugs: Improving the safety of sex workers, Alex Bryce A workshop exploring the reasons why sex workers are targeted by criminals and why they are often reluctant to report to the police.

### What about Lads'Mags and Page 3?, Gemma Short

We want to discuss some of the issues around lads'mags and page 3 then discuss what response feminists should/could have to them. We will be discussing ranging issues from sex workers' rights, depictions of sexuality, how a narrow masculinity is sold for profit, anti-sex and prudish messages, the working class nature of publications often targeted by campaigns and much more.

### **Sound Engineering 101,** with Redhouse sound experts

Shadow a sound engineer during set-up and sound check to discover what this important role of any gig is all about. It'll be hands on, helping to put up mic stands, set monitors, plug in mics and DJ equipment and give vital infoon monitor levels and front of house sound.

### LaDIYfest (noun) (pron; lay dee aye why fest)

LaDIYfest Sheffield is an inclusive, DIY, anti-capitalist, community-based feminist collective involved with local activism and a range of events and activities, culminating in a weekend of festivities at the end of the year. In 2012 we will be running a series of discussion groups and practical workshops discussing feminist issues whilst continuing to organise socials and fundraise for local community groups.

We want to create a celebration of women with an emphasis on the artistic, the creative and the political. We oppose the part that capitalism plays in the oppression of women. We want to raise awareness of women's issues and engage local women with local women's organisations to create a more equal society for everyone. We will do this by providing a platform to highlight feminist and LGBTQ art, projects and activism through music; performance art; spoken word; films; discussion; art exhibitions and practical workshops, promoting social change in a non-discriminatory environment.

LaDIYfest Sheffield is part of a global movement which grew out of the DIY and Riot Grrrl scenes. Since the first Ladyfest, which was held in Olympia USA in August 2000, feminists worldwide have adopted the name and organised Ladyfests in their own towns. We salute you for inspiring us to continue making this happen.

LaDIYfest Sheffield is organised by a collective of volunteers and led primarily by self identified women but anyone who shares our goals is welcome to get involved.

We hope people of all genders, abilities, ages, ethnicities and sexualities will feel welcome to participate!
